

### Lynn and 1986 Taiwan Democratic Party


- In 1985 Lynn and his wife Sachiko worked for two weeks with the hunger strike of Linda and the "California gang" in Washington D.C.
- Out of this developed the "Return the Taiwan Democratic Party to Taiwan" movement, with Hsu Hsin-liang and Hsieh Tsung-min leading – Taoyuan airport, November 30, 1986, Lynn lay on tarmac but was carried back to plane...

## Lynn worked for the DPP


- Lynn was finally allowed to return to Taiwan in 1996, at the invitation of the DPP. He worked in the foreign relations department for nearly two years.
- Lynn also worked for Lu Hsiu-lien in the Presidential Office in about 2004, in preparation for the Democratic Pacific Union. However, he was not happy with the emphasis on current power holders.





#### Lynn and Sachiko in about 1991, Delaware Water Gap



#### 1988, American Peace Test

I was living in Connecticut when, in early 1988, Julie, a young canvasser for Green Peace, came knocking on our door. Within the literature handout was a brochure by American Peace Test, an ad-hoc coalition calling for people to join in a one-week camp to be held in front of the main gate of the Nevada Test Site (NTS). I decided to go, and got in touch with APT, who in turn introduced me to people in New Jersey who were trying to put together a group who would assemble in Trenton and drive all the way across the US to the NTS in three days.
